Ranch Rules and Policies

Hours

Ranch employees perform maintenance that may be noisy, or alarming to horses. We request that use of the facility is limited to:

Monday: 12 pm – 1 hour before sunset

Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday, Sunday: 7:30 am – 1 hour before sunset

General Rules

- There is no smoking or recreational drug use allowed at the Ranch.
- Drive slowly.
- All boarders/riders must have a signed liability waiver on file with Osuna Ranch before boarding or riding at the facility.
- Riders, 18 and under, must wear a safety approved helmet while mounted.
- Riders, 18 and under, must ride under the supervision of a Ranch sanctioned trainer or responsible adult.
- It is recommended that all riders wear a safety approved helmet while mounted.
- Tie horses only to cross-ties or inside stalls or paddocks. Tied horses may not be left unattended.
- Horses must be groomed or tacked up in the grooming cross-ties.
- Horses must be hosed down or bathed in the wash racks. Do not feed or clip horses in the wash racks.
- Horses may not be mounted inside the cross-ties, stalls or paddocks.
- Breakaway halters must be used on all horses during turn-out. Halters should be removed when horse is stabled or in its paddock.
- Horses may be grazed in the grass turn-outs. Use of turn-outs is limited to one hour per horse per day. Use of turn-outs are under the control and discretion of Ranch Foreman.
- Tack space will be allocated by Ranch Foreman.
- Feed and supplements must be stored as directed by Ranch Foreman.
- Horses may not be lunged in the arena.
- The arena may be closed at the Ranch Foreman's discretion.
